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Dear Parents,

I hope that this email finds you and your family well and that you were able to enjoy the Easter break (considering the circumstances). As we return to online schooling, I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of the provision you and your child can expect.

- The amount of education that your child receives should be equal in time commitment to that which they would receive in school. This will be a mixture of synchronous (live face-to-face via Google Meet) and asynchronous (video/independent work set on Google Classroom).
- The timetable of lessons is the same as pupils would follow in school. Therefore, it is recommended that pupils should aim (as far as possible) to create the same routine at home from 9:00am to 3:30pm. The school fully understands why this might not be possible in some households (illness/sharing of computers, etc) and this is the reason for a mixture of synchronous and asynchronous lessons.
- Pupils can expect at least half of the lessons for each subject to be synchronous (via Google Meet).
- When lessons are via Google Meet, pupils can expect at least 24 hours' notice.
- The length of lessons in years 7-9 has been reduced from 40 minutes to 35 minutes.
- The best way for you as a parent to follow the work that is being set is to ask your child for their Campion email address and password. This is a school account for schoolwork and should not contain any personal or sensitive information that your child might not wish to share with you. Therefore, they should not have any reason for not sharing their Campion School password with you.
- Year 11 pupils will study a unique and bespoke pre-IB course for the summer term.
- All external exams have been cancelled (IB diploma, IGCSE and Checkpoint). There is no plan for Year 9 pupils to sit the Checkpoint exams and consequently grades will not be awarded. For IB diploma and IGCSE pupils, a mixture of coursework and predicted grades have been submitted to the examination boards and we await their moderation/standardisation process before we know what the final grades will be. Pupils will have the opportunity to appeal examination results or resit their exams (either November or next May) if they are unhappy with their final grade. The school has made a commitment to all Year 11 pupils that wish to return to Campion and study the IB diploma programme that pupils will not be disadvantaged by the cancellation of the IGCSE examination series.
- It is still too early to say what will happen to the internal end-of-year school exams. Plans are being discussed but the final decision will depend on when pupils eventually return to school.

Once again, if you know that your child is having difficulties completing the work, for whatever reason, please be proactive and contact their respective Year Tutor. A reminder that teachers (as well as pupils) are not allowed onto school premises at the moment. School is open only for a few skeleton staff and only on three mornings a week. Therefore, if you do need to contact the school for whatever reason the best means of communication is via email but please bear in mind that all members of staff are receiving a significantly increased amount of email correspondence during this period of time.

We know that school is closed until at least Monday 11th May and we eagerly await the government's announcement as to when pupils (and teachers) can return to school. We look forward to this occurring. In the meantime, I once again invite you to complete a survey asking any questions that you may have.
